Open Meeting and Establish a Quorum:

Chair Singfield called the meeting to order at 7:35am in the Willson Board Room at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital. Mr. Singfield thanked all Members for their attendance and participation and he observed that a quorum was present.

Approval of the Agenda:

The proposed Agenda had been previously provided to the Authority Members and a motion to adopt the proposed Agenda for the meeting was made by Ms. Hubbard and seconded by Mr. Johnson. A copy of the Agenda as adopted is attached.

Approval of the Minutes:

The proposed Minutes of the February 18, 2021 open session meeting of the Authority had likewise been provided to Members prior to this meeting and the same were considered for approval. Ms. Hubbard made a motion and Ms. Tucker seconded the motion, to approve the Minutes as previously provided. The motion passed unanimously by vote of all Members. The proposed Minutes of the April 20, 2021 open session training session of the Authority had likewise been provided to Members prior to this meeting and the same were considered for approval. Mr. Johnson made a motion and Mr. Callins seconded the motion, to approve the Minutes as previously provided. The motion passed unanimously by vote of all Members.

Financial Reports:

Mr. Church presented and reviewed an interim financial report for the Authority's current fiscal year through April 30, 2021. Mr. Church also provided an update on the Upper Payment Limit Program and how the Authority participates to receive additional matching funds for the community and patients. A copy of the Authority's Financial Statements as presented by Mr. Church is attached. The Members engaged Mr. Church in discussion.

PPMH, Inc. CEO and Operational Reports:

Mr. Austin provided an update on current COVID-19 conditions at Phoebe Main and North. He presented PPMH COVID-19 data for admissions, average admissions/day, average daily census, and number of deaths for March 2020 through April 2021. He also provided an update on Phoebe's COVID-19 vaccine initiative and noted today is the last day of Phoebe's mass vaccination site. Mr. Austin reported vaccines will be available at Phoebe's Urgent Cares, Primary Cares and Mobile Wellness Units. He also reported on Phoebe's collaborations and other vaccine efforts going forward. Chair Singfield inquired about COVID treatment protocols at Phoebe with Dr. Grant and Dr. Hudson providing an update including IV infusion treatments and the post-COVID clinic. Chair Singfield suggested Phoebe's current marketing campaign include testimonies from COVID patients to encourage people to get the COVID vaccine.

Mr. Austin also provided updates on construction projects including the hospital lobby, 4E-Medical COVID unit, 7T-ICU COVID unit, 2W/3W medical gas upgrades at Phoebe North, and the new Urgent Care location to be built on Highway 19 in Lee County. He reported on Georgia House Resolution 1664 which commended Mr. Steiner and Phoebe Health System for their efforts and service during the COVID-19 pandemic. Mr. Austin reported Dr. Eddie Black and Kim Whitley, RN were recognized by Georgia Trend as 2021 Georgians of the Year for their efforts during the COVID pandemic. He also reported Governor Brian Kemp helped Phoebe unveil the new Mobile Wellness Clinics in March. Mr. Austin also reported on Phoebe's educational partnerships with local educational institutes to help increase the number of graduates from area nursing programs.

A copy of the CEO and Operational report as presented is attached to these Minutes.

Closing of the Meeting:

A motion was made by Mr. Callins, seconded by Mr. Johnson to close the meeting for the purposes of: (i) engaging in privileged consultation with legal counsel; (ii) to discuss potentially valuable commercial plans, proposals or strategies that may be of competitive advantage in the operation of Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital or its medical facilities, or (iii) to discuss confidential matters or information pertaining to peer review or provided by a peer review organization as defined in O.C.G.A.§31-7-131.



Medicaid Upper Payment Limit Payments

- Certain Hospitals quality for supplemental payment to help subsidize regular Medicaid Payments that are **less then costs**.
- These payments are paid in additional to the regular Medicaid payments and are often referred to as Upper Payment Limit (UPL) payments.
- The Maximum that Medicaid can pay (i.e. the UPL) is the either cost or what Medicare would have paid for a service provided to a Medicaid patient.
- Supplemental payment levels are determined by calculating the difference between the UPL and what Medicaid actually paid hospitals for inpatient an outpatient services.

UPL Process

- Governmental Entity Participation agreements are required to be filed with DCH. The practice has been for the Authority Chair to sign the agreements as they are requested by the state.
- Without HAADC completing/authorizing program agreements, these additional "matching" funds would not be available to our community/patients.
- HAADC authorized the Chair to sign the participation agreements a number of years ago as they are requested by DCH so these funds can be utilized to provide critical health services to the underserved residents of our community.

UPL Program Expansion

- Currently there is the Hospital and the Physician UPL programs for "Fee For Service" = Traditional Medicaid
- Georgia Department of Community Health has recently approved expansion of the Physician UPL to include the "Direct Payment Program" = Medicaid Managed Care providers (Peach State, CareSource, Amerigroup, WellCare)

UPL Program Expansion

- HAADC Chair needed to sign the participation agreement before the DCH set deadline of May 19th, 2021
- Phoebe will provide HAADC \$885,051 to wire to the DCH who then provides as the State Share to pull down \$3,306,191 federal funds, netting our community \$2,421,079 in UPL funds for the 1st half of State Fiscal Year 21.
- Second UPL payment expected under this program for same/similar amounts. Timing unknown at this point most likely August or later.






PPMH COVID-19 Admissions






PPMH COVID-19 Admissions/Day






PPMH COVID-19 Avg. Daily Census






Phoebe Putney Health System COVID-19 Admissions April 1 – May 15 n = 79





Phoebe Putney Health System COVID-19 Admissions Non-Vaccinated Patients April 1- May 15 n = 73



Phoebe Putney Health System COVID-19 Admissions Vaccinated Patients (at least 1 dose) April 1- May 15



"Hunger is one of the major issues with COVID," Crouch says. "People have lost everything. I'm not just talking about people at risk for hunger before, I'm talking about people who probably were never
